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Estimate of Violence Risk

Risk Probability

The likelihood that Sample A. Client will commit a violent act toward another person in the next several months is estimated to be between 20 and 32 percent, with a best estimate of 26 percent.*

Risk Frequency

Of every 100 people like Sample A. Client, between 20 and 32 are estimated to commit a violent act toward another person in the next several months, with a best estimate of 26 people. **

Risk Category

Sample A. Client is estimated to pose an Average risk of committing a violent act toward another person in the next several months.

^{*}In comparison, the likelihood that a randomly chosen patient discharged from an acute civil inpatient unit will commit a violent act toward another person in the next several months is estimated to be between 16 and 21 percent, with a best estimate 19 percent.

^{**}In comparison, of every 100 patients discharged from acute civil inpatient units, between 16 and 21 are estimated to commit a violent act toward another person in the next several months, with a best estimate of 19 people.
