The OWLS-II scales can be administered separately or together.

## PARALLEL FORM

A new parallel form allows you to retest students on all scales after a brief interval. Form B can be given within days if there is reason to believe that the initial OWLS-II administration was invalid or a second administration is desired to monitor progress. The age range for Form B (for all four scales) is 5–0 through 21–11.

## SCORES

Each scale yields its own interpretable score. In addition, scales can be combined to generate composite scores.

#### SCALE COMPARISON USING THE NEW COMPREHENSIVE PROFILE FORM

The four OWLS-II scales can be compared with one another to provide information on meaningful differences, which can guide intervention planning. # ITEM ANALYSIS

• OWLS-II items are categorized according to the linguistic structure(s) they measure. These descriptive labels permit detailed, item-level analysis (outlined below), which can inform intervention. Item Analysis Worksheets are included in the LC/OE and RC/WE Record Forms. Chapters 2 and 4 of the LC/OE and RC/WE Manuals describe Item Analysis Worksheets and explain their use.
