#### Introduction


The Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI) is a risk and needs assessment tool. This report summarizes the results of the YLS/CMI assessment over time, and provides information pertinent to the assessment of the individual. The results of this inventory can be helpful in formulating a case management plan for the juvenile. See the YLS/CMI User's Manual published by MHS for more information about this instrument and its results.

This computerized report is an interpretive aid and should not be given to clients or used as the sole basis for diagnostic decisions and case management plans. This report works best when combined with other sources of relevant information.

Scores represent the number of items overall or within an assessment area that apply to the juvenile being assessed.

Range	Risk Level
0 - 8	Low
9 - 22	Moderate
23 - 34	High
35 - 42	Very High
















